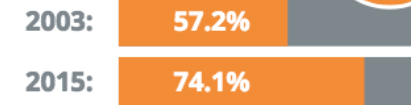

**WITH ADMINISTRATORS:**  
Online is a great way for  
administrators to **diversify**  
revenue streams.

**WITH EDUCATORS:**  
74.1% of academics rated learning  
outcomes in online education as  
the same, or superior to those in  
face-to-face instruction<sup>(3)</sup>  
That's up from  
57.2% in 2003.<sup>(3)</sup>



**WITH STUDENTS:**  
Online accounted for nearly  
75% of all US higher education  
enrollment last year!

The Internet is a **necessary component** of our personal, educational, and professional lives.

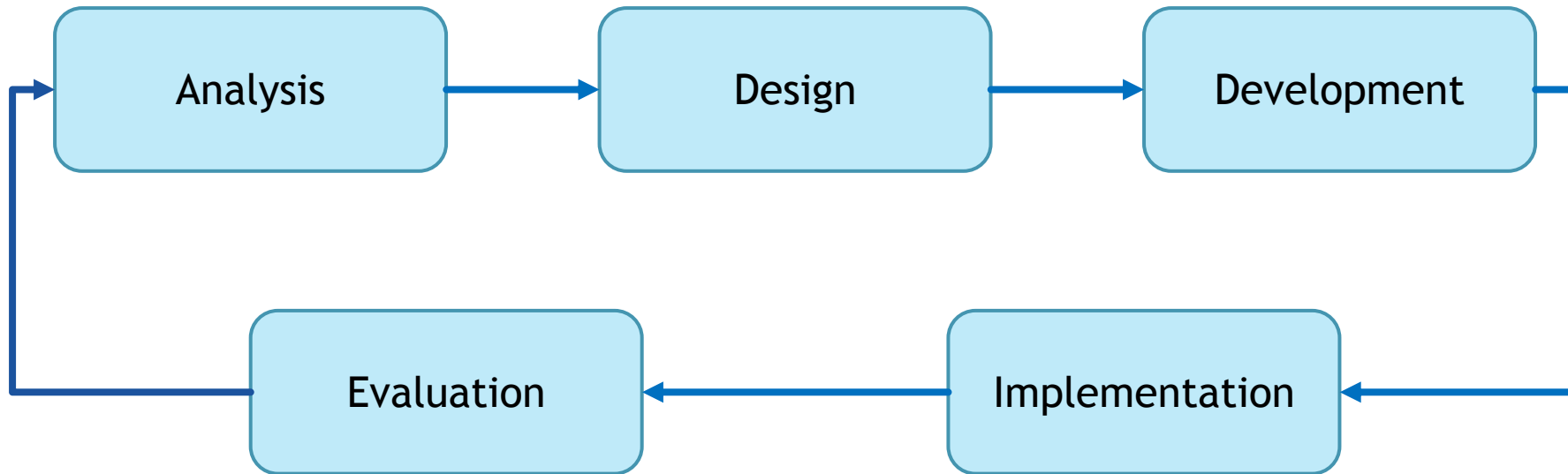


In 2012, **nearly 63% of U.S. colleges offered fully-online degree programs.**<sup>3</sup> That's almost double what it was a decade earlier, at just **32.5%**.

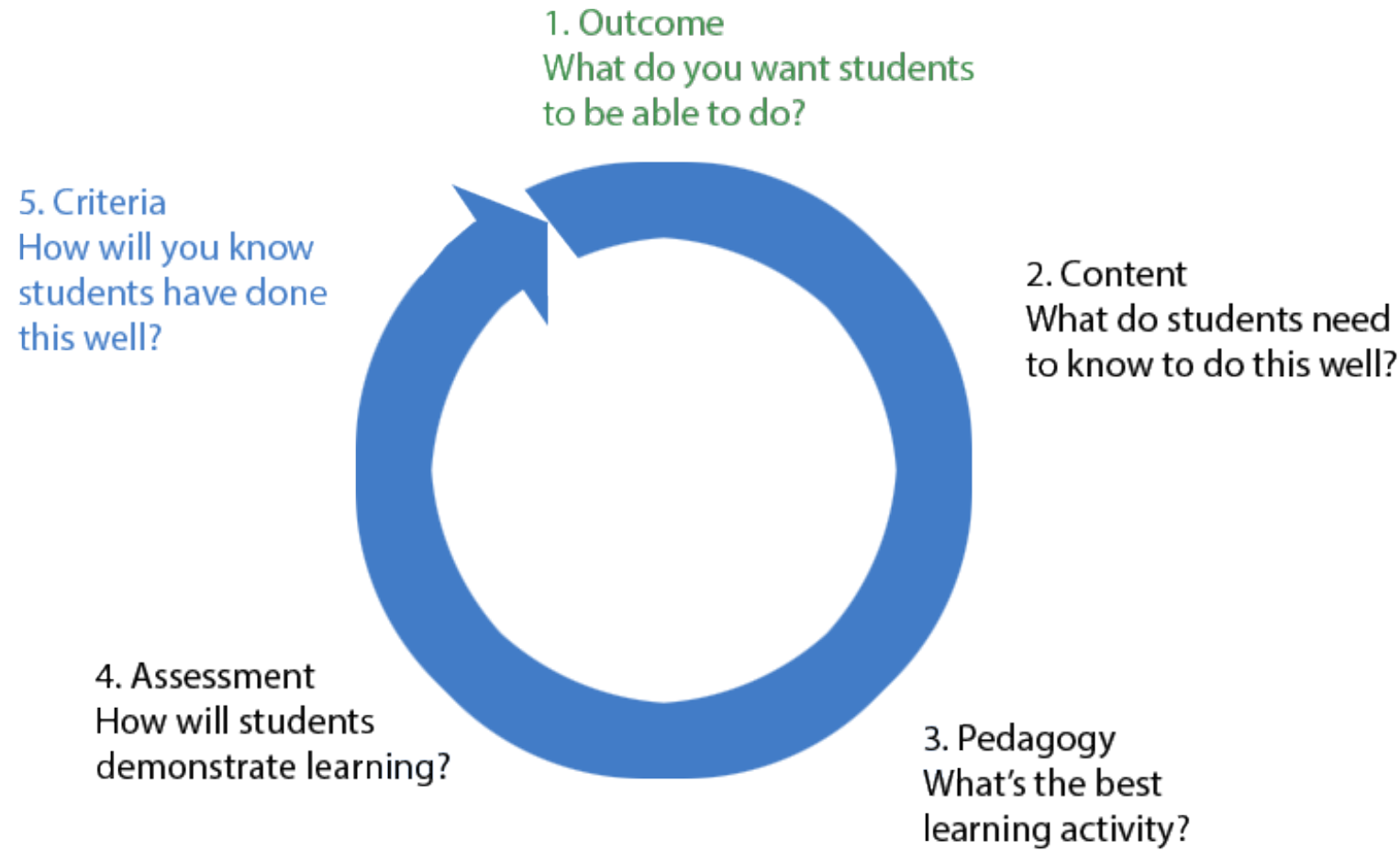


Nearly **70% of online education** occurs within the traditional **nonprofit sector.**<sup>4</sup>
